Most Wanted fugitive captured in east Florida

NEW PORT RICHEY – The Pasco Sheriff's Office and the U.S. Marshal's Service are pleased to announce that double homicide suspect Luc Pierre-Charles Jr. has been captured in east Florida, more than two months after a warrant was issued for his arrest and six weeks after he was placed on the Marshal's 15 Most Wanted List.

Luc Pierre-Charles Jr., DOB 2-5-1988, was arrested at a relative's house at 1057 Lake Moore Avenue, Rockledge, at about 11:45 p.m. last night. Members of the U.S. Marshal's Florida Regional Fugitive Task Force received permission from the homeowner to search the house where they found the defendant hiding in a bedroom, located between a bed and the wall. He was not armed, but refused to cooperate and was tasered. He was then taken into custody without further incident and refused to make a statement.

Pierre-Charles Jr. is wanted for the murders of Derek Pieper and Raymond Veluz. Their bodies were found in the early morning of July 28, 2006, near 35744 Trilby Road, in Trilby. Pieper was 17 and Veluz was 18. Pierre-Charles' last known address was 31107 Messena Road, Wesley Chapel.

Members of the Task Force also arrested co-defendant Tyree Jenkins, DOB 2-2-1986, on July 24, 2008, on a Pasco warrant for the same case.

The U.S. Marshal's Florida Regional Fugitive Task Force is comprised of federal, state and local law enforcement officers that combine resources and efforts daily to apprehend violent fugitives of justice in Central Florida, as well as nationwide through networking with task forces across the county.
