CLEAN RECOVERY CENTERS

Clean Recovery Centers offers a path to recovery from alcoholism, addiction, and untreated mental health issues. Most major insurances are accepted. Pasco Sheriff's Office members should confirm your insurance is accepted prior to seeking services. Clean Recover Centers Enrollment Process includes a verification of benefits with the patient's insurance provider (approximately 15 minutes) and a phone assessment (approximately 15 minutes). Once accepted, Clean Recovery can send transportation for pick-up if no transportation is available.

CopLine is the first international law enforcement officer's hotline, answered entirely by retired law enforcement officers. An active or retired officer or their family member can call 24/7 and be assured there is a trained retired officer on the other end of the line. "Cops understand Cops. We have been exposed to similar situations in our careers. Whether you're active duty or retired and feel like no one understands what you're going through, we want to answer your call". Operation Restore is a 3-night, 4-day program held at the Franciscan Center in Tampa, on eight quiet acres on the Hillsborough River. First responders receive personal, confidential treatment after experiencing critical incidents, line of duty deaths, and the general effects of pressure throughout their careers. The program incorporates counselors, psychiatrists, psychologists, peer-support, and trained professionals who treat post-stress using one-to-one counseling, group processing, education, and a proven scientific technique called EMDR, or eye movement desensitization and reprocessing. The Retreat at Largo Medical Center is a destination first responders and their adult family members. All rooms are private, confidential space complete with bathroom and desk space for your convenience. The goal is to increase coping, validate emotions and assist in challenging negative thoughts.

Treatment plans are individualized based on needs during the voluntary stay and include: Private, confidential entrance. NO emergency room visit and alias used upon request. Daily private meeting with attending psychiatrist. Private meeting within 24 hours of arrival by therapist for support and individualized treatment planning. Daily groups include: psychotherapy, art, music and recreation therapy. HIPPA Confidentiality. No questions asked policy. No communication with First Responder agency. Largo Medical Center Indian Rocks Road Campus is honored to be able to support those that serve and protect our community every day.
